Kwasi was lead drummer with Sankofa Dance Theatre from 1977 to 1981, under the tutelage of Godwin Agbeli. He has performed with numerous drum and dance societies in Ghana. Kwasi is founder and artistic director of Kekeli Drum and Dance Ensemble (Toronto) as well as West African Cultural Exchange Centre in Dagbamete, Ghana (affiliated with the Centre for National Culture).
